23/390.1 Highways (SS)

Shopping list for highways requests is being prepared for Cllr Ham's meeting. Potholes have been sprayed, but not filled, paint has since worn out. Gritting – After discussions with highways representatives, our parish roads are grade C, so no gritting under policy. However, continuity is important, Wiltshire grit to hilltop, so perhaps this is an angle to pursue, will follow up. Current gritting route goes Nunney catch to Trudoxhill, Witham, Upton Noble to include school – unclear as councillors were told differently, will ask for clarification.

23/390.2 SpeedWatch (SS)

ASW information has been circulated, should be in the parish plan questionnaire. Much cheaper, more effective, agreed to push ahead with project, clerk to pursue. Cllr Clarke will connect us with a clerk at Hemington council who have a successful program for best practices and advice.

23/390.3 The Village Hall

A minor leak that was reported in the façade has been fixed. Events going well with good community attendance, more members of the parish are running their own events too, such as the popular bookclub.

Budget overspend is £24M, estimated £37M at years end. Grants available on SCC website food, whitegoods, oil heating, energy. Highways shopping list to Cllr Clarke, please. Constitution committee focusing on planning and LCNs. Reorg still running very late.
